## WELCOMING NEW STUDENTS:

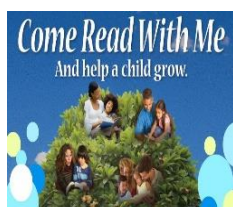
### On Monday, 13<sup>th</sup> February:

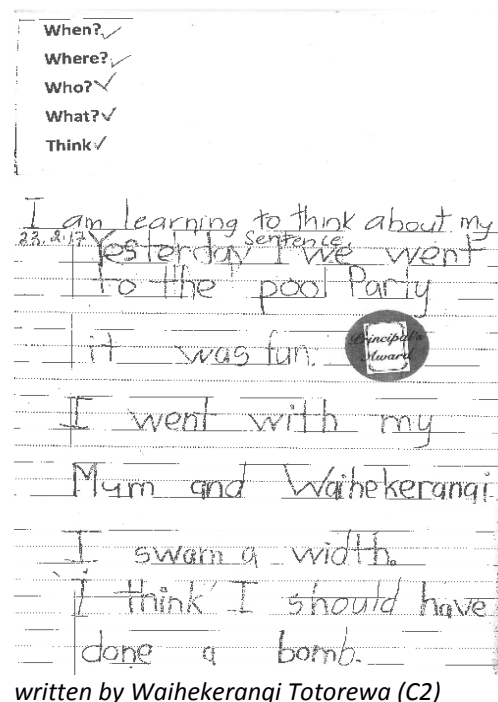

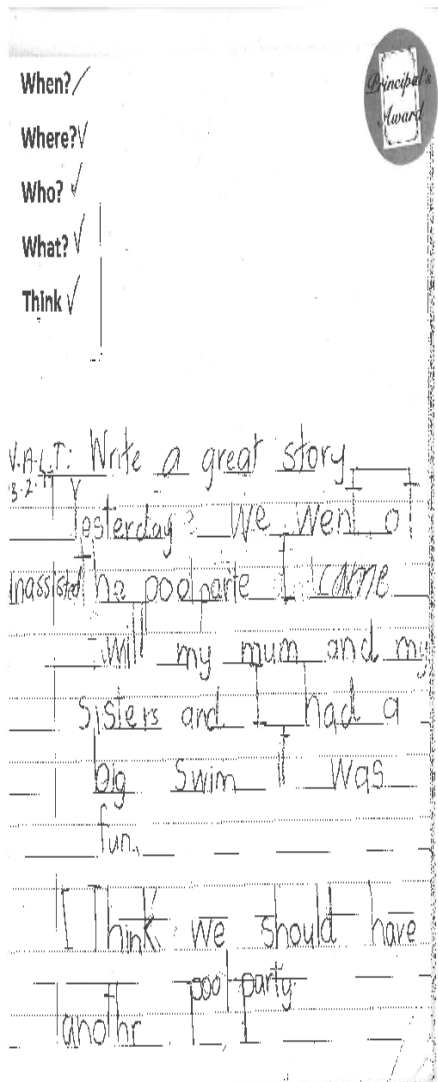
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## TE KURA O TE PĀROA

### WHAKATĀNE CHILDREN'S MUSIC AND DRAMA SCHOOL.

The Music and Drama School gives children the chance to have music lessons on instruments of their choice, at a minimal fee. The lessons are taught by experienced tutors appointed and funded by the Ministry of Education. The classes are usually limited to primary and intermediate children of 9 years and older. The lessons run throughout the year during term time, and end with a massed concert in November. In 2016 the concert featured an orchestra of over 100 children. Whakatāne is most fortunate to host these classes in • recorder • flute • fife • violin • brass (small & large) • guitar • clarinet • saxophone • percussion (drums) • theatricals (drama). Preference is always given to the older children, but children may enrol from 9 years old (Drama is open to younger students). The enrolling takes place on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> March when parents may bring their children to Whakatāne Intermediate School Auditorium between 9 – 11 am, to enrol and meet the tutors.
